### LETTER FROM PASTOR MICHAEL



#### Church Family,

As summer winds down, I've been thinking about the timeless rhythms of harvest season. Throughout history, this has been when all the hard work of planting and tending finally pays off. The Lord sure has been doing much at Zion Hill!

The Bible often speaks about sowing and reaping as a fundamental life principle. Whatever we plant, we eventually harvest. Just like a farmer who prepares soil, plants seeds, and tends crops eventually enjoys abundance. I love how Paul puts it in Galatians 6:9: "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

Our faith journeys work the same way. Those prayers, spiritual disciplines, and acts of service are all seeds we've planted. Even when growth seems invisible - like watching corn grow - something important is happening beneath the surface.

Prayer: Where Fruitful Work Begins

Prayer isn't separate from our work - it's what makes our work meaningful. Jesus reminds us in John 15:5, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."

When we pray, we align our efforts with God's purposes. We invite God to partner with us. As 1 Corinthians 3:7 says, "Neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow."

#### The Value of Hard Work

While prayer is essential, God also values our diligent effort. Proverbs has plenty to say about this:

"Lazy hands make for poverty, but diligent hands bring wealth." (Proverbs 10:4)
From the very beginning in Genesis, humans were called to "work the ground." There's something sacred about rolling up our sleeves and getting to work, especially when we do it prayerfully.

#### Learning to Wait

If there's one thing farming teaches us, it's patience. Unlike our Amazon Prime world, agriculture follows unchangeable seasons. You can't rush from seed to harvest.

James 5:7-8 makes this connection beautifully: "See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains. You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near.

#### Questions to Consider

- What seeds have you planted this year through prayer and action?
- Where are you starting to see growth in your life?
- Where might God be asking you to be more patient?
- How can you better bring prayer into your daily work?

#### A SIMPLE PRAYER

#### God of the Harvest,

As summer turns to fall, we're reminded of how You've designed everything to have its season. Thank You for showing us that faithful prayers and honest work eventually bear fruit in Your perfect timing.

Help us work in ways that honor You. Keep us from anxious striving without prayer, but also from laziness that expects You to do everything. Teach us instead to pray as we work and work as we pray.

When results seem slow in coming, give us patience and renewed trust. Remind us that life's most important harvests often take the longest to mature.
